School Profile

Burleigh Heads State School (BHSS) was established in 1917. The school has an enrolment of approximately 550 students from Prep to Yr 7. The school has an ECDU and a Special Education Unit. The school has several significant curriculum offerings that cater for our diverse range of students. Yrs 6 and 7's rotating timetable structure enables teachers to specialise in subject areas, thus exposing students to a variety of strategies and styles. The school has a thorough screening process in the early years that identifies students who require support, enabling targeted learning and intervention. Extracurricular offerings include camps, instrumental music, choirs, Eisteddfods, interschool and cluster sports days, days of excellence, excursions, visiting performances and programs, and festivals. Students have access to a new computer lab with smaller computer pods throughout classrooms. Currently we have 1 interactive whiteboard between 2 classes. Parents are encouraged to be involved in their children's education through direct involvement in classrooms, as volunteers or through the Parents and Citizens Association. The latter supports a wide range of activities that provide financial support to the global budget.
